Tools: Brushes, Cheesecloth, Jig Saw, Paint Roller,




step 1. Trace the pattern onto 1/4" plywood

step 2. Cutout using jigsaw



Paint base layer with SetCoat® Metallic (True Silver) apply 2 coats







step 4. Using spray adhesive, adhere first stencil. Using Layering Paint™ (Berry and Mustard) mix an orange/red and apply through the stencil

## Allow to dry 2 hours



Using spray adhesive, adhere second stencil. Apply Layering Paint™ (Mustard) through the stencil

## Allow to dry 2 hours





step 6. Using spray adhesive, adhere third stencil. Apply Layering Paint™ (Coal) through the stencil

#### Allow to dry overnight

step 7.

Gently sand through layers to create age and wear

step 8.

Use dampened cheesecloth to rub through areas to distress

step 9.

Use the Designer Rust™ Kit to add natural looking rust

step 10.

Use cheesecloth to apply water thinned Stain&Seal® (American Walnut)

How to build the Scratcher Box (other side)













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Products: Elmers® glue, Cardboard

Tools: Small Paint roller, Razor Knife/Box Cutter





## How to build the Scratcher Box

step 1. Gather 100 sheets of cardboard (24"x16.5" or larger)

step 2. Trace the patterns onto the cardboard

step 3. Cut out the layers (cut 3 solid layers for the back)

step 4. Using  $\mathsf{Elmers}^{\texttt{@}}$  glue and a small roller. Glue the layers together and weigh it down





#### Allow to dry

step 5. Use Elmers® glue to adhere the face to the scratcher box and weigh down again

Allow to dry
